Why make a new test?

Prostate cancer is the most diagnosed and second most deadly cancer for men in the United States.

Early detection through screening has been shown improve mortality rates. However, screening rates have been declining since 2008 due to the problems of overdiagnosis and overtreatment associated with PSA based screening. Subsequently, projected prostate cancer deaths have increased 18% over the last two years in the United States.

Why Semen?

The prostate's main function is to produce seminal fluid. This is the ideal sample to look at when looking for signs of prostate cancer. Additionally, a semen sample can be acquired in the privacy and comfort of your own home and will allow us to provide expanded access to men everywhere.

What do I have to do?

After giving informed consent to participate in the study you will be given a collection kit in an orange box.



The process:

1. Provide informed consent and sign consent form in clinic.
2. Take collection kit home or if available & preferred to a private room in the clinic.
3. Provide a semen sample in specimen cup.
4. Fill out and affix label to specimen cup.
5. Return sample to clinic **within 1.5 hours** of sample collection.

That's it!

The requirements:

If you are a man age 50 – 70 who has never received treatment for prostate cancer and is healthy enough for sexual activity; you are most likely a fit for this study.

The risks:

There are minimal risks for participating in the study, but a complete list is included in the Informed Consent Form.

How do I participate?

If interested, talk to your physician about participating in the study. They will present you with the informed consent form and answer any questions you may have.

What do I receive?

Unfortunately, because the tests have not yet been approved for use by the FDA, we are not able to provide you with the results of the testing.

However, for your time and inconvenience you will receive a \$100 gift card when you submit the sample.

And your generous sample donation could play a role in the development of better tests for prostate cancer that could improve the outcomes for generations of men.
